In Luke's gospel, Jesus notices wealthy people dropping their contributions into the Temple treasury, as well as a poor widow dropping in two small coins. Contributions were

dropped into one of 13 trumpet-shaped chests placed throughout the Temple interior. The odd shape of the chests was to prevent dishonest people from taking the coins out of the receptacles. The widow's *mite* was worth about half a penny, which was the average day's wage at that time. In other words, the widow likely donated all the money she had to live on.
