A black man born into slavery, **John Augustus Tolton** was baptized Catholic in 1854 in Hannibal, Missouri. Although his family was considered free during the Civil War, they suffered painful discrimination within the community and even within the Church. With the help of a neighboring Irish priest, the young Augustus was able to graduate from St. Peter School, with the hope of becoming a Catholic priest. Unfortunately, not a single American seminary would accept a black man during the 1880s time period. With the aid and assistance of the same Irish priest, Augustus entered a seminary in Rome and was ordained at the age of 31 in 1886, "Father Gus" celebrated his first Mass on Easter Sunday, 1886, at Rome's St. Peter's Basilica. Returning to America, he spent the majority of his priesthood in Chicago's highly black-populated "South Side", where his gentle ways and capacity to love, forgive, and serve people of every color and creed, despite the prejudice he himself experienced, witnessed to the Gospel message.

Venerable Father Augustus Tolton is currently in the process of consideration as a future Catholic Saint.
