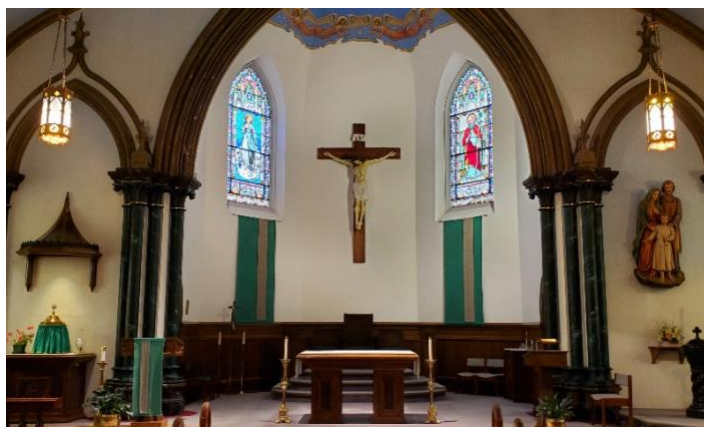

CHRIST THE KING

The Church's liturgical year ends on the Feast of Christ the King, which is the last Sunday of Ordinary time and falls in late November, this year November 23. The feast is the final Sunday before the arrival of the new liturgical year and the season of Advent. The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, in the hope that the proclamation of Christ as King of the Universe would serve as a corrective to the dangerous political ideas of the time, ideas that had led to one devastating world war and would soon bring a second war to the horizon. Jesus is a king like no other, a king who reigns from the cross, who has none of the trappings of earthly power, but chooses to empty himself and lead mankind to paradise.

On this Feast of Christ the King, our readings show us that we serve the greatest of Kings, who is at the same time the humblest of Kings. Christ is the perfect model of servant leadership. What powerful lessons this King teaches us from the Cross. We learn that true leadership is displayed in emptying ourselves for others; that true greatness is displayed by way of humility; that none of us is worthy of the call to stewardship of His kingdom but that all of us, like the good thief, are welcomed and invited to take up this call. Following in His footsteps will involve suffering and sacrifice.
