Featured Saint

St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274)

An Italian Dominican friar, priest, theologian, and philosopher, Thomas Aquinas is considered one of the most influential thinkers in the history of Catholic theology and Western philosophy. Honored with the title Doctor of the Church, his greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings where he expounded on the gospel and ardently defended the revealed truth of Jesus Christ. Thomas Aquinas serves as a towering example of Catholicism in the sense of broadness, universality, and inclusiveness. The Church celebrates the Memorial of Thomas Aquinas each January 28. Fast or Feast

In Mark's gospel, Jesus was asked why the Pharisees fast, yet the disciples of Jesus do not fast. Jesus responds by saying, "Can the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is still with them?" In other words, Jesus is teaching that more important than fasting is being with God and responding to his presence - in this case rejoicing with Jesus the bridegroom. While fasting is an important spiritual practice, there are times for fasting and there are times for feasting. In moments when God draws near, we refrain from fasting and revel in feasting.

Stewardship REFLECTION

Today's readings remind us that stewardship is not just a thing we do – rather, stewardship is at the core of who we are as disciples of Christ. Our first reading, from Isaiah, contains this prophecy of Christ and what His saving message would mean to all who embrace it. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone." We are among those blessed people on whom the light of Christ has shone. By virtue of our Baptism, we who were once in the darkness and gloom of original sin have been born again into the great light that is God's grace in us. We have become cherished members of God's family. What a privilege! Yet, with this privilege comes the responsibility to actually live for God and to bring His good News to all those we meet at work, at school, in our community and right in our own home. This is the essence of a stewardship way of life – to be always ready for the ways that our Lord is calling us to bring His light to others. It's more than something we do ...it's who we are.
