Ash Wednesday Thought

In Matthew's Gospel for Ash Wednesday, we hear Jesus remind us three times that our hidden acts are neither unseen nor unrewarded. *"Your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you."* The single most important penance one can offer during Lent is the patient bearing of the daily crosses of each of our lives. All are lugging some type of cross on a daily basis, be it family related, work concerns, health issues, etc. Be patient with your cross and offer in the silence of your heart hidden prayers for the crosses of others. These hidden acts of self-sacrifice are proof of genuine love you possess within your heart and soul. Such love heals and lightens the load of your personal daily cross. *"And your father who sees what is hidden will repay you many times over."*

Stewardship REFLECTION

Today's readings challenge us to reflect on the true state of our hearts as it relates to stewardship. Do we think of stewardship as something we take care of once a year, simply a matter of ticking off boxes on a commitment card – or do we choose to embrace it as a spirituality and way of life that allows us to grow in conformity to Christ every day?

The concept of stewardship helps us to live out the fundamental choice to put God first. Stewardship is not meant to be a mere external exercise in which we participate on an occasional basis. It is meant to be embraced as a way of life that involved a continuous conversion of heart.

Our Lord is asking us not only for exterior acts, but for a true change of heart. In stewardship terms, that means seeing everything as a gift from Him, to be used for His glory and the good of others. In the week ahead let us examine the state of our hearts to ask ourselves if we have chosen to allow stewardship to become a way of life for us. Only then will we experience it's true depth and heart-changing possibilities. The choice is ours.

Featured Saint

**Blessed Maria Julia Rodzinska
(1899-1945)**



Maria was born in Nawojowa, Poland, in 1899. Her parents both died when she was ten years old, and she was subsequently educated by Dominican nuns. She decided to enter the Dominican Order and for twenty-two years, she worked as a teacher and administrator in a Polish

orphanage. Known as the "Mother of Orphans", she was arrested by the German Gestapo on the charge of aiding and abetting Jews to escape from German-controlled Poland prisons. Tortured and confined to solitary confinement in the notorious Stutthof concentration camp, she continued to offer peace and comfort to fellow prisoners as they approached death. Maria died in 1945 after contracting typhus while caring for a bed-ridden inmate, two months before Stutthof was liberated. In 1999, she was beatified by Pope John Paul II as one of the 108 Polish Martyrs of World War II.
