SIMON STEPS UP



In the Passion narratives, Jesus is struggling to carry the cross through the streets of Jerusalem on the way to his execution at Golgotha. In order to keep Jesus from dying from exhaustion on the street, the Roman soldiers realized he needed help, so they plucked Simon of Cyrene out of the crowd to help Jesus bear the cross. Whether Simon stepped forward willingly or by force, the reality is that Simon's assistance is a beautiful, yet painful, picture of our calling as disciples of Jesus. The lesson of Simon is that the call to step forward and help others is often sudden and seemingly random. As Christians we are often called to pick up our own cross, as well as helping others with the crosses on their shoulders.

Lenten Thought

As we turn the corner and enter the final stretch of Lent, it is good to look back at Ash Wednesday and the Lenten plans we developed at that time. If you've slipped a little from your original thoughts, don't be discouraged, as the final two weeks of Lent bubble to an intense crescendo. The Mass readings of the final weeks of Lent are rich in the drama faced by Jesus in his final earthly days. It all reaches a peak with the events of the 3-day Triduum, the highlight of the entire Church year, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Saturday. In the sweeping drama of the Passion, amid the betrayals, lies, cruelty, horror, and final triumph of Jesus, one thing is certain, Jesus commands every second. Even on the Good Friday cross we see unmistakably that Jesus, God himself, is in charge. His authority is our surety and is the basis for our faith as Catholics. Savor and hold tight the events of Holy Week with a belief and appreciation for just exactly what Jesus did for us in the final days of his life.
