One Nurse's Cross

Maria Restituta Kafka (1894-1943) was an Austrian nurse of Czech descent, and a nun of the order Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity. On Ash Wednesday, 1942, while serving as the head surgical nurse at a hospital in Vienna, Austria, she was arrested by Nazi authorities for refusing to remove crucifixes from patient rooms. In fact, she hung more. Sentenced to death for her disobedience to the Nazis, she was offered freedom if she would leave the hospital and her religious order. She adamantly refused both options. Imprisoned on death row for the following twelve months, Sister Maria was executed on March 30, 1943. Her final words to the executioners were, "*You can take my life and all my possessions, but you cannot touch the love and faith I have for the Lord in my heart and soul.*" Sister Maria was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1998.
