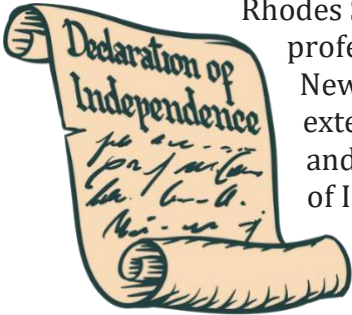

The Greatest Sentence Ever Written

Walter Isaacson is a Harvard and Oxford, England, Rhodes Scholar, currently a history professor at Tulane University in New Orleans. He has studied extensively the development and writing of the Declaration of Independence and has concluded that the second sentence, crafted by Thomas Jefferson and edited by Benjamin Franklin, became the creed that bound a diverse group of pilgrims and immigrants into one nation. For people with many different beliefs and backgrounds, it defined our common ground and American Dream. In his recent book, *The Greatest Sentence Ever Written*, Isaacson contends that the sentence balances the role of divine providence and that of reasoning in determining American rights. As we celebrate America's 250th birthday this week, the words of the second sentence of the Declaration of Independence bear scrutiny and appreciation.



"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among them are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."
