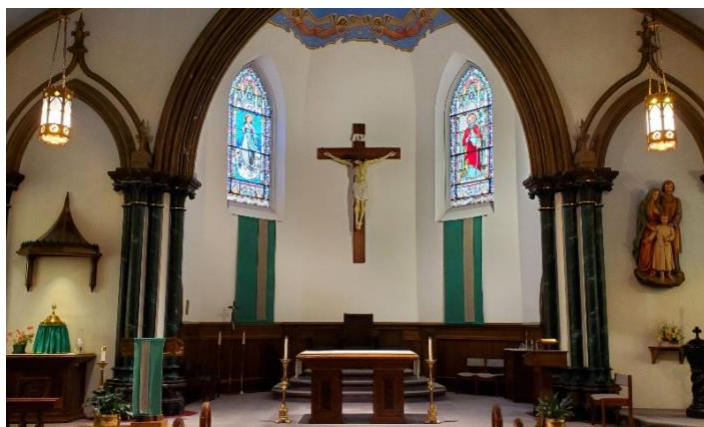

Want to volunteer? Middle and high school students can help, but those 14 or older must first complete the Protecting God's Children training through the diocese and other PA background checks.

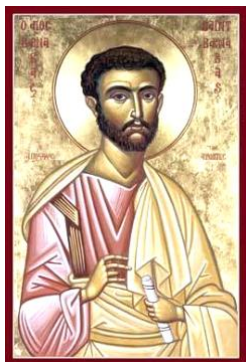

Featured Saint

St. Barnabas

1st Century AD

Memorial - June 11



St. Barnabas, a Jew of Cyprus, comes as close as anyone outside the Twelve to becoming a full-fledged Apostle. He was closely associated with St. Paul, introduced Paul to Peter and the other Apostles, and served as a kind of mediator between the former persecutor Paul and the still suspicious Jewish Christians.

A charismatic preacher and leader, Barnabas dedicated his life to the Lord, being "*filled with the Holy Spirit and faith*", thereby adding large numbers to the Lord.

St. Barnabas is considered the patron saint of Cyprus, encouragement, and second chances.

Corpus Christi

Today's Feast of Corpus Christi is a Catholic celebration of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and a sacred reminder that, in every Mass, Jesus' one sacrifice at Calvary is sacramentally made present and offered anew for "*the forgiveness of sins we daily commit.*" (Catholic Catechism 1366). The Church celebrates Corpus Christi to profess and adore our Eucharistic Lord. Our Catholic faith rests on the foundational belief that Jesus is truly present body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist. The great Catholic Eucharistic hymn *Tantum Ergo*, Latin for "*Therefore so great*" was composed in the 13th century by St. Thomas Aquinas in honor of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus.
